APPENDIX 8 HEALTH & SAFETY SIGNAGE


Health & Safety signage around University buildings on the Edinburgh bioQuarter campus is displayed for good reasons, some of which are statutory obligations.

Compliance with safety signage is expected of all staff, students and visitors.

Correct signage must be used where appropriate. It is just as important that signage be removed from areas where the hazard no longer exists so that, in an emergency, the Scottish Fire & Rescue Service *etc* know exactly what the threat is before entering an area.

Warning tape should only be used where there is a hazard, and must be removed when the hazard no longer exists.




