D Conditional Offers and Confirmation of Examination Results

Please keep and refer to this section when your examination results are announced.

- 1. If your offer is conditional on SQA Higher or Advanced Higher passes, on GCE AS or A level passes, or on Irish Leaving Certificate passes, there is no need for you to notify us. The University is informed directly of these results via UCAS.
- 2. If your offer is conditional on passes in any other examinations you must inform the Biomedical Teaching Organisation (address below) of your results as soon as they become available. Please send copies of your results to the address below.
- 3. If you do not meet the terms of your conditional offer, your application will, nevertheless, receive careful consideration. If you wish to draw attention to any extenuating circumstances such as illness, you should inform the Biomedical Teaching Organisation at the time of the examinations, and not wait until your results are announced; it may by that stage be too late to take additional factors into account.
- 4. Offers based on SQA or GCE passes are expressed in terms of letter grades and not numerical points. For example, an offer set at two B grades means that two passes at B grade or above are required; a combination of one A grade and one C grade is not regarded as the equivalent of two B grades.
- 5. Provided that we receive copies of your educational certificates and your offer is, or becomes, "Unconditional Firm" then we will send you a joining pack via the EUCLID portal. This will contain a formal letter confirming admission together with information about Freshers' Week and registration and fee paying procedures.
