- Policy Frameworks for Business Continuity and Emergency Management (issued through the Risk and Resilience Department).

The University will

- ensure a health and safety management system is in place which identifies and manages risk, plans objectives, reviews and monitors management standards and implements action creating continuous improvement.
- · consult and collaborate with staff and students on health, safety and wellbeing.
- strive to deliver best practice, where appropriate, and ensure as a minimum, legal compliance with legislative requirements.
- have suitable systems in place to respond to emergency situations and major incidents.
- provide its staff and students with the suitable training, information and instruction as appropriate to reduce the risk of harm to them and others from their activities.
